Dr. Hsing Kung is a well-respected community leader. He is married to Margaret, with one daughter, Angela. His family has resided in south bay for thirty years and always actively involved in community work.

In recent years, Dr. Kung has devoted to promote Chinese-American participation in main stream community. He was a former board member of Fremont Union High School District Board. In his tenure, he has made significant contribution to promote multi-culture climate in high schools. In addition, he also involved in many other community programs and foundations, including Cupertino Rotary, Institute of Computer Technology, West Valley- Mission Community College Foundation, Fremont Union High School Foundation etc .With Dr. Michael Chang, a Cupertino Council member and civic leader, they co-founded Silicon Valley Voters Education Service Center. In 2003, he was invited to join a Blue Ribbon Task Force for Santa Clara County of Education. Currently, he serves on United Way Silicon Valley Board, San Jose Rep Board, Foothill DeAnza Foundation Board and American Leadership Forum Silicon Valley board.

Hsing Kung received a BS degree from National Cheng Kung University, a Ph.D from UC Berkeley, all in Electrical Engineering. He also received a MBA degree from Santa Clara University.

From 1974 to 1978, he was with Optoelectronics Division of Hewlett Packard. In 1983, Dr. Kung joined SDL Inc. as a co-founder and VP, manufacturing. SDL has become a world leading optical communication company. In 1997, he joined American Xtal Technology (AXT) as a Sr. Vice President, Business Development. Currently, he was a co-founder and President/ CEO of Pine Photonics Communication. After Pine was acquired by Opnext Inc, he continued to serve as Sr. VP of Opnext until 2005. He also serves on the boards of several optoelectronics companies. Current, he serves as Chairman of Luxnet Corporation and Partner of Acorn Campus Ventures .

In January 2007, he was awarded “Community Hero” award from World Journal. Other awards include:

- In 1997, he received Distinguished Alumni Award from Northern American National Cheng Kung University Alumni Association.
- In 1999, he received Paul Harris Fellow from Rotary foundation.
- In 2000, he received “2000 year of the Dragon Award” from Chinese American Voter Education Committee.

- In 2002, he received “Asian American Hero 2002” award from County of Santa Clara
- In April 2004, he received “Community Star Award” from Asian Americans for Community Involvement
- In 2004, he received “The Helen Tao Activist of the Year” award from Silicon Valley Asian Pacific American Democratic Club
